

Reflections on the Wisdom from St. Francis

“With God there is no respecting of persons, and the Holy Spirit, the general minister of our order, rests equally upon the poor and the simple.” (Second Life by Thomas of Celano, 193.)

Saint Francis wanted his brothers to gather every year for their general chapter on the feast of Pentecost. Perhaps he recalled what was said in the Acts of the Apostles: “The day of Pentecost found the disciples all gathered together in one place.” Francis knew that each friar had his own personal relationship with God. Yet, since Jesus had also said, “Where two or three gather in my name, there I am in their midst,” how important it was to gather periodically in His name. Francis himself experienced over the years the power of the Spirit guiding the brothers as they came together to discuss their life and seek God’s will for them. His *Rule* was the fruit of many years of reflection by all the brothers on what it meant to be a Friar Minor. The friars, sisters, and secular Franciscans today still experience this, as they gather at certain times to seek God’s will and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, true minister general of all Franciscans. May the blessings of the Spirit be with you on Pentecost and always!

MINORITY - *Following the meek and humble Christ and sharing our joy as lesser brothers by walking with people of every social condition*

As brothers of St. Francis, we faithfully follow the meek and humble Christ.

- We cultivate a disposition of humility and respect of the dignity of others.
- We share our joy as lesser brothers by walking with people of every social condition and by being instruments of reconciliation.
- We commit ourselves to the evaluation of our lifestyle, both individually and communally.

ASSISI PARDON

PORZIUNCULA PARDON is always available under the conditions the Catholic Church has stipulated.

The conditions for receiving the Porziuncula Pardon are:

To receive the Porziuncula Indulgence, one must receive sacramental absolution and receive Holy Communion at Mass. Additionally, one must visit a church where one prays at least the Creed and an Our Father for the intentions of the Pope. Additionally, one must be completely free of any attachment to sin; if this condition is not met, the indulgence is partial rather than plenary.

At the National Shrine of St. Francis of Assisi, the Pardon of Assisi may be received on October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (in the Shrine Church); on any two days of one’s own choosing during the year (one day in the Church and one day in the Porziuncula Nuova); and as often as one makes a formal pilgrimage as part of a group to the Shrine Church or to the Porziuncula Nuova. (One may receive a plenary indulgence only once a day and it may be applied to oneself or to the soul of one of the faithfully departed.)




REMINDER OF THE ARCHDIOCESAN CONSECRATION TO MARY

On October 7, 2017 the Archdiocese of San Francisco was consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our blessed and ever-faithful mother! Here is an excerpt from Archbishop Cordileone's Message at the Consecration, urging each and every Catholic in the Archdiocese to follow the urgent pleas of Our Lady at Fatima:

*"Our Lady at Fatima called the children to prayer, penance, and adoration. I repeat that call to you: I call every Catholic in the Archdiocese of San Francisco to **pray** the rosary every day, as she asked, and the family rosary once a week. I call every Catholic in the Archdiocese of San Francisco to **fast** every Friday of the year, as she asked, giving up some food such as meat, or drink, or sweet, or even a whole meal. I call every Catholic in the Archdiocese of San Francisco to **adore** silently before the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus once a week, as she asked--fifteen minutes, a half hour, an hour. I am calling every Catholic in the Archdiocese of San Francisco to these simple but most effective practices, as Our Lady asked, for the conversion of sinners and for peace in the world. Only she can help us."*
