ASSISI PARDON

PORZIUNCULA PARDON is always available under the conditions the Catholic Church has stipulated.

The conditions for receiving the Porziuncula Pardon are:

To receive the Porziuncula Indulgence, one must receive sacramental absolution and receive Holy Communion at Mass. Additionally, one must visit a church where one prays at least the Creed and an Our Father for the intentions of the Pope. Additionally, one must be completely free of any attachment to sin; if this condition is not met, the indulgence is partial rather than plenary.

At the National Shrine of St. Francis of Assisi, the Pardon of Assisi may be received on August 2nd, the Feast of Our Lady of the Angels (in the Shrine Porziuncola chapel); October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (in the Shrine Church); on any two days of one's own choosing during the year (one day in the Church and one day in the Porziuncula Nuova); and as often as one makes a formal pilgrimage as part of a group to the Shrine Church or to the Porziuncula Nuova. (One may receive a plenary indulgence only once a day and it may be applied to oneself or to the soul of one of the faithfully departed.)

CAPUCHIN FAMILY DAY III

July 3 is a special day in the Capuchin calendar, for it is the date of the papal bull *Religionis zelus* (1528) by which the Capuchin reform was recognized officially 491 years ago. Each year on this day we remember that we are a Capuchin family and we celebrate the spiritual bonds that unite us with about a hundred institutes of consecrated life that are part of the Capuchin story. Therefore on July 3 we will gather as a family in order to:

- **Thank God** in common prayer or in the celebration of the Eucharist for the gifts received as a spiritual family and to remember our founders;
- **Break bread** together fraternally and in dialogue, highlighting our identity as brothers and sisters and sharing our current situations;
- **Plan some simple steps** to strengthen our bonds, such as collaborations and mutual awareness of our activity.

Each friary, fraternity, and place is a space to take up this simple initiative and to keep alive the gift the being a family, adapted to different realities. Another, more convenient date may be chosen, but with the same purpose of communion and mutual rapport.

The proposed theme for 2019 invites us to reflect on the meeting of St. Francis with the Sultan as well as the fourth centenary of the death of St. Lawrence of Brindisi as a means to study the topic of **intercultural dialogue** through the sharing of experiences and inspiration.

“The Apostle says: The letter kills, but the spirit give life. Those people are put to death by the letter who only wish to know the words alone, that they might be esteemed wiser than others and be able to acquire great riches to give to their relatives and friends.”

Admonition VII.

Francis of Assisi knew the great power of the Scriptures, but he also knew it was a great challenge to translate that power into true life. Knowledge of the bible was important to him: it is said he had a great number of scripture passages memorized. But only knowing the words was not enough: they had to make a difference in the way he lived, in the words he spoke and the attitudes he maintained. That, in the end, is what impressed people about Francis. He did not simply talk about faith or preach great truths—he made them real by spending time in prayer, service to others, especially the poor, and simply becoming the person God had made him to be, and so Francis became for others a source of spirit and life in Jesus.
