

As brothers of St. Francis, we faithfully follow the meek and humble Christ.

- We cultivate a disposition of humility and respect of the dignity of others.
- We share our joy as lesser brothers by walking with people of every social condition and by being instruments of reconciliation.
- We commit ourselves to the evaluation of our lifestyle, both individually and communally.

ASSISI PARDON

PORZIUNCULA PARDON is always available under the conditions the Catholic Church has stipulated.

The conditions for receiving the Porziuncula Pardon are:

To receive the Porziuncula Indulgence, one must receive sacramental absolution and receive Holy Communion at Mass. Additionally, one must visit a church where one prays at least the Creed and an Our Father for the intentions of the Pope. Additionally, one must be completely free of any attachment to sin; if this condition is not met, the indulgence is partial rather than plenary.

At the National Shrine of St. Francis of Assisi, the Pardon of Assisi may be received on October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (in the Shrine Church); on any two days of one's own choosing during the year (one day in the Church and one day in the Porziuncula Nuova); and as often as one makes a formal pilgrimage as part of a group to the Shrine Church or to the Porziuncula Nuova. (One may receive a plenary indulgence only once a day and it may be applied to oneself or to the soul of one of the faithfully departed.)

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM WEEK

June 22—29

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) asks Catholics to observe Religious Freedom Week, saying: "We are called to follow Christ as missionary disciples by serving others and living our faith in all that we do. Let us take a few moments each day from June 22 - June 29 to pray, reflect, and take action on religious liberty, both here in this country and abroad." The USCCB website has extensive resources including bulletin inserts and policy statements: usccb.org. Events will be held nation-wide during this period.

In the Archdiocese of San Francisco, Archbishop Salvatore J. Cordileone will ask all parishes to hold a holy hour during the week. In addition, the following archdiocesan events are open to all:

John Fisher and Thomas More, executed at the order of King Henry the VIII. Following Vespers, the Young Adult Ministry invites young adults (21-39) to a happy hour with Archbishop Cordileone, 6:15 pm at Steins Restaurant, 732 Clement St. (near 9th Ave.).
- **June 27: Young Adults Mass for Religious Freedom** with Auxiliary Bishop Robert Christian, O.P. St. Dominic Church, 2390 Bush St., San Francisco, 7:30 pm
- **June 29: Vespers and Panel Discussion Sts. Peter and Paul Church**, 666 Filbert St., San Francisco, 7:00 pm Held on the feast day of Sts. Peter and Paul. Followed by a discussion of the international implications of religious freedom with representatives of a missionary society and others from countries where Christians face persecution. Wine and cheese, coffee and cookies provided.


