Reflections on the Wisdom from St. Francis

"Behold, each day He humbles Himself as when He came from the royal throne into the Virgin's womb." Admonition L

Many in medieval Assisi were obsessed with the idea of "upward mobility." The important thing was to get ahead, to dominate others, whether through money, power, prestige, or popularity. Young Francis of Assisi was caught up in this dynamic. He wanted to change his status, to get ahead, to become greater than others, to be a "maior." Then he encountered the presence of God in a leper, and he learned something about Jesus: that He continued to humble Himself for our sake, that He was present in the lowly, the poor, the outcasts. It was the humility of God, shown in the Incarnation and continued in the Eucharist, that became Francis' model for how to live. Francis decided he would find meaning in life in "downward mobility," in learning to serve others as a lesser brother (a friar minor), and in this he encountered true happiness. God bless!

ASSISI PARDON

PORZIUNCULA PARDON is always available under the conditions the Catholic Church has stipulated.

The conditions for receiving the Porziuncula Pardon are:

To receive the Porziuncula Indulgence, one must receive sacramental absolution and receive Holy Communion at Mass. Additionally, one must visit a church where one prays at least the Creed and an Our Father for the intentions of the Pope. Additionally, one must be completely free of any attachment to sin; if this condition is not met, the indulgence is partial rather then plenary.

At the National Shrine of St. Francis of Assisi, the Pardon of Assisi may be received on October 4th, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi (in the Shrine Church); on any two days of one's own choosing during the year (one day in the Church and one day in the Porziuncula Nuova); and as often as one makes a formal pilgrimage as part of a group to the Shrine Church or to the Porziuncula Nuova. (One may receive a plenary indulgence only once a day and it may be applied to oneself or to the soul of one of the faithfully departed.)

POPE FRANCIS TO NEW CARDINALS: `KEEP THE FACES OF THE DISTRESSED BEFORE YOU'

Pope Francis reflects on Jesus' interaction with the disciples on the way to Jerusalem during the Consistory in which he created 14 new Cardinals.

(*Vatican City; June 28, 2018*) Pope Francis on Thursday invited the 14 new Cardinals to follow Jesus, to eliminate vain and self-centered discussion in the Church, in order to further the interests of the Father. He drew

inspiration from the Gospel of Mark (10:32-45) read during the Ordinary Public Consistory.

Hearts revealed

The disciples are walking with Jesus to Jerusalem having just heard the

prediction of his passion the third time. Jesus walks ahead of them. Pope Francis defines this moment as important and crucial, one in which "the heart can speak and reveal the intentions and tensions within us". The secrets hidden in the disciples' hearts begin to manifest themselves: "the quest for honours, jealousy, envy, intrigue, accommodation and compromise", Pope Francis said.

Hearts refocused

Jesus continues walking ahead without focusing on their pettiness. "The Lord tries to refocus the eyes and hearts of his disciples" by firmly saying "It shall not be so among you; whoever would be great among you must be your servant" (*Mk* 10:43). The Pope said Jesus gave us this principle to eliminate vain and self-centered discussions from the community of disciples in order to bring out the best in their hearts.

Hearts converted


Pope Francis continued saying Jesus' teaching is that of conversion. He said conversion allows the Church to seek the Father's, rather than personal, interests. The "moment of truth" happens when we come face to face with those in distress. Keeping their faces before us helps us carry out the Church's mission; losing sight of those faces we get bogged down "in the pursuit of our own interests and securities", the Pope said.

Hearts in service

In conclusion, Pope Francis reminded the new Cardinals that Jesus continues walking at their head. His example of washing the disciples' feet before "bowing his head on the cross", the Pope said, is the greatest honour to which the Cardinals are called.

This is the highest honour that we can receive, the greatest promotion that can be awarded us: to serve Christ in God's faithful people.
